



# Heathland Wildlife Spotter



**Dartford Warbler**

A resident bird, seen all year round which nests on the ground



**Emperor moth**

One of the UK's largest insects with up to 10cm wingspan



**Common lizard**

Likes to bask in the sun, especially on deadwood or stone



**Southern Damselfly**

Found near slow flowing, shallow water



**Gorse**

A dense, spiky shrub which smells of coconut, especially in the sun



**Stonechat**

Sings from the top of gorse, sounds like stones clapping



**Heather**

Delicate, pink flowers from August-October



**Kestrel**

Has a distinctive hover when in flight



**Adder**

Zig-zag patterned and very shy, females are brown, males are grey

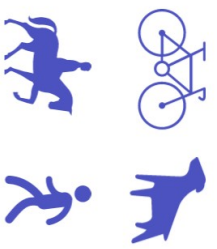
